Ep. 1: Walking the Dog. Mille and Martin often see their neighbours walking their dogs. They are sometimes allowed to walk a small dog, too - they are big enough for that. Their only problem is a big black dog that frightens both other dogs and children.

Ep. 2: Out Fishing. One of Mille and Martin's neighbours has a goldfish in a glass bowl. Wouldn't it be nice for the goldfish, they think, if it could be taken for a walk like other animals? Then it might be able to make friends with some of its own kind.

Ep. 3: A Bird Party. Several of Mille and Martin's neighbours keep birds in a cage. The birds look rather lonely, each locked up alone in their cage. Mille and Martin want to help the birds to have fun together, the way human beings do.

Ep. 4: The Tortoise and the Hare. Mille has a tortoise. Martin doesn't have any pets, but he does have a rabbit clock. That is enough to enable the two to run races between the hare and the tortoise, just as in the fairytale.

Ep. 5: Horses for Courses. Mille and Martin would have loved to ride some of the horses stabled near to where they live, but are told they aren't big enough, so the only thing they can do is to make a horse and rider themselves.

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
